collecting has a long tradition in the middle east but the museum as a public institution is relatively new today there are national museums for antiquities in most arab countries while in some cases the political and social climate has hindered the foundation of museums with existing collections even destroyed at times the recent museum boom in the gulf states is again changing the outlook this unique book is the first to explore collecting practices in archives and museums in the modern arab world featuring case studies of collecting practices in countries ranging from egypt and lebanon to palestine jordan iraq and the gulf and providing a theoretical and methodological basis for future research the authors are also concerned with investigating the relationship between past and present since collecting practices tell us a great deal not only about the past but also about the ways we approach the past and present conceptions of our identities collections can be textual as well as in the stories memories or events selected recalled and retold in the pages of a text as interest in memory studies as well as popular and visual culture grows in the arab world so collecting practices are at the heart of any critical approach to the past and the present in that region the book will be of great interest not only to scholars and students of the modern arab world but also to professionals in museums and collections in the region as well as around the world

this book sheds light on an as yet unstudied aspect of the museum of modern art s moma preeminent role in establishing the definition of the problematic term latin american art in the united states from the 1930s to the present through its collection displays in examining the shifting categorization of latin american works according to stylistic and geographic taxonomies we gain a greater understanding of the organization of the museum s collections as a whole during the 1940s and 1950s this book is the first to document these institutional precedents crucial for the understanding of the articulation of a modernist canon and its contested legacy today the moma is widely recognized as the preeminent institution that defined 20th century art through its collection shaping our understandings of the history of art with its hierarchies and exclusions as they sediment over time moma s holdings of art from latin america shed light on a key period when the stylistic categories that have since come to be accepted by many today as the modernist canon developed moma s collection displays suggest ways in which artists from areas of the world formerly excluded can be incorporated within today s increasingly global museums moma s approach may be compared to initiatives adopted by several museums since the 2000s creating geographically defined curatorial positions as a way to redress gaps in collecting art from latin america and other areas of the world in this book author miriam m basilio gaztambide offers a closer study of the history of collection displays as a means to understand canon formation in modern art museums this work will be of interest to those researching latin american american modern and contemporary art and curatorial and museum studies

this collection of fourteen essays by distinguished art and cultural historians examine points of similarity and difference in british and american art collecting half the essays examine the trends that dominated the british art collecting scene of the nineteenth century others focus on american collectors using biographical sketches and case studies to demonstrate how collectors in the united states embellished the british model to develop their own often philanthropic approach to art collecting

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re envisioning the contemporary art canon perspectives in a global world seeks to dissect and interrogate the nature of the present day art field which has experienced dramatic shifts in the past 50 years in discussions of the canon of art history the notion of inclusiveness both at the level of rhetoric and as a desired practice is on the rise and gradually replacing talk of exclusion which dominated critiques of the canon up until two decades ago the art field has dramatically if insufficiently changed in the half century since the first protests and critiques of the exclusion of others from the art canon with increased globalization and shifting geopolitics the art field is expanding beyond its euro american focus as is particularly evident in the large scale international biennales now held all over the globe are canons and counter canons still relevant can they be re envisioned rather than merely revised following an introduction that discusses these issues thirteen newly commissioned essays present case studies of consecration in the contemporary art field and three commissioned discussions present diverse positions on issues of the canon and consecration processes today this volume will be of interest to instructors and students of contemporary art art history and museum and curatorial studies

over the last several years collectors have come to the forefront of the art scene becoming key figures if not stealing the spotlight from curators and institutions but speculation stratospheric prices opinionated leadership and the spectacle of collecting are only some of the many facets of the current reality for many collectors contemporary art is essentially an aesthetic and intellectual adventure thus the construction of each collection a personal journey and a singular statement in an attempt to map the contours of this archipelago the present volume gathers interviews with 40 collectors from

During the final decades of the Ancien Régime, prominent collectors in Paris commissioned and collected French paintings of the period, works by Greuze, Fragonard, David, and others that together comprised *l'école française*, the French School. In this book, an art historian discusses six of these collectors and the collections they assembled, showing that private patronage in this period was revitalized by this patriotic desire to collect contemporary art. Colin B. Bailey explains why a taste for modern art emerged at this time and how it was encouraged and fostered, examining the relationship between artist and patron. He discusses the degree of influence these enlightened patrons and collectors expected to exercise when new works were being commissioned. Bailey shows that collectors of eighteenth-century French painting seem not to have made rigid distinctions between the various genres or styles of the Academy's practitioners; instead, history paintings and genre paintings, both Rococo and Neoclassical, were exhibited proudly on their walls as superb examples of the French School.

This volume gathers together recent research from leading scholars specializing in the history of collecting American Southern art collections, both public and private, which contain rich and representative holdings of Renaissance and Baroque art, which remain understudied compared to the collections bracketing the East and West Coasts of the United States. This anthology considers how these works of art were acquired for both prominent public and private collections.
